to believe TAKES COURAGE AND TRUST

While traveling and interacting with many Deaf women leaders and the Deaf women they are ministering to, I encountered so many stories that are dying to be heard, told, and shared...

We met one young Deaf woman, "Priya", who has been attending a Deaf Function Can School to study English and computer training. She met a friend at school who told her about one of DOOR's Deaf woman leaders. She gave Priya the phone number to text and video chat with her. Priya then visited the Deaf woman leader's home and met her in person. As Priya began coming to the Deaf Believers' Fellowship (church) and attending Chronological Bible Story classes, she began to understand. **Her heart was broken when she saw the story of Jesus being crucified; He suffered and died for her sins.** The Deaf woman leader then explained, in a deep way, why Jesus had to die.

Priya longs to learn more about Jesus and to believe in Him. However, she is being oppressed by her parents and siblings. They won't let her return to the Deaf community.

When Priya was young, her parents transferred her from a Deaf school to a hearing school. She was the only Deaf student. **While in town for training, she found there were many Deaf there and she was so happy; she felt loved and enjoyed the sense of community.** On her birthday, they gave her a party with cake and gifts. She appreciated their encouragement and support. After she completed her training, Priya returned home, hoping to return to the town again in the near future. But her family made her stay home, and she ended up living like a slave to her mother and siblings.



Please pray that the Lord will break the chains of bondage that oppress and enslave many Deaf women like Priya. Pray that these women would be reached with the knowledge of Christ, accepting Him into

their hearts and lives, **that they may find the value they are looking for in their lives.** Pray for all of our Deaf women leaders as they continue to minister, reach out, and encourage Deaf women in their places of service across South Asia.

Pray for stamina and good health as I continue to travel. **I will be going to another country in South Asia to encourage the Deaf women leaders there; then, I will travel to Thailand for a time of reflection and rest.** Finally, I will be in Kenya for two months. In Kenya, the majority of my time will be spent working on the topics for the Deaf woman leaders that will begin filming in November.
