

face to face with the Slibar* team

I have just returned from two weeks of work with a translation project in Asia. In a country where around 75% of the population are Hindu and about 16% are Buddhist, Christians are a rarity. It is amazing that God has opened up a way for a Bible translation project in the sign language of this country. During our time together we were able to check 252 verses from seven different passages. It was amazing to see the passion this group of men have for God's word. I was so encouraged to work with them. The team members long for additional teaching and when we were not working directly on the translation project we were often still discussing scripture. Pray for these men. The opposition to Christianity is great. Pray for their protection and for their growth. Pray that God will continue to teach them and mature them. Pray for wisdom for them as they lead the Deaf Church in their area.

Along with working in Asia I have been working with the Kenyan Sign Language (KSL) translation project. We recently completed a community comprehension test of the of the current set of passages they have drafted. The KSL translation is a very important translation since it is the first sign language translation in Africa and many other translation teams in the region use it to help them better understand the Bible as they work on translating it into their own country's sign language.

The classroom type training has now been completed and the three teams have begun to do more practical training, drafting translations of scripture passages. I have been working with the team from Eswatini. It is fun to work with new teams and watch them grow and improve in their translating and on-camera signing skills.
