### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

As we move into our ninth year with DOOR (wow, where does the time go!), we are watching as the organization itself grows and matures.

Back in 2014 when we first joined DOOR, DOOR had active work in 10 countries, with about 120 staff and an annual budget of \$2.2 million. Today in 2023, DOOR has active work in 34 countries, with about 230 staff and an annual budget of \$6.5 million. That means we have tripled the countries that we impact! That impact includes work in language survey, sign language Bible translation, video Scripture distribution, evangelism/church planting teams, and technology support.



That kind of growth as an organization has required a deep level of investment in our Deaf leaders who lead these various areas. **Every organization is only as strong as its leadership.** Right now, there are very few (if any) leadership development materials available in sign language, especially any that approach leadership development in a way that matches Deaf culture and is replicable in many different international contexts (and written/sign languages!).

A significant part of Rob's leadership in DOOR involves investing in Deaf leaders, including developing this kind of training. DOOR's most recent leadership meetings here in Orlando in late January were a great example of that. Rob worked to train DOOR's leaders on supervising, supporting, and evaluating staff; problem solving; setting goals and tracking progress; and many other topics critical to DOOR's growth. (Keep in mind that all of this training happened in Kenyan Sign Language!)

And none of this growth would be possible without our full reliance on the Lord and his leadership of DOOR. A key verse for us continues to be from John 15:5: "I [Jesus] am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." Please continue to pray for Rob and our other leaders as they shepherd and guide this critical work.
