MARCH

KENYA - LEADERSHIP MEETINGS

DOOR's Deaf Board (called our International Ministry Council, abbreviated as 'IMC') met at DOOR's Kenya campus in late March to review what has happened this past year, look ahead to the future of the organization, and discuss a restructuring of the IMC to better fit the future needs of DOOR.



SOUTH AFRICA - SOUTHERN AFRICA GATHERING

Rob was invited to a gathering hosted by Wycliffe US to discuss translation plans across southern Africa. The meetings involved a number of national and local partners and projects spanning nine countries. DOOR has been (or likely will be) involved in each of those translation projects. Rob was able to provide training at the meetings on Deaf culture, along with coordinating some partnership conversations.



APRIL

CYPRUS - EURASIA GATHERING

A larger gathering of translation organizations and Deaf leaders across Eurasia (Europe, Central Asia, the Middle East, and North Africa) took place in Cyprus. Over 50 countries were represented. DOOR was there as one of the international partners to present, train, and provide technology and resources for partners in the field. The meetings garnered much prayer and excitement about the future of sign language Bible translation!





GREECE - FOBAI ANNUAL MEETING

In late April, the Forum of Bible Agencies International (FOBAI) held its annual meeting in Athens, Greece. Sign language translation work continues to be a high impact point for many translation organizations, and DOOR is helping partners navigate how to connect with Deaf leaders and serve Deaf communities well. Rob serves on the board of FOBAI.



GRAND RAPIDS, MI -BOARD MEETINGS

Right on the heels of the FOBAI meetings, DOOR had our semi-annual board meetings. We are so grateful for an amazing group of men and women who pray, support, and lead this endeavor through their critical board work.
