Model - Show potential leaders how to do a particular skill or task, modeling how it is done

development: Model,

Assist, Watch, Leave.

- Assist The new leader does the task, with us there to observe and make suggestions
- Watch The emerging leader refines their skills, with us providing less direction
- **Leave** Help them apply this approach to leadership development with another potential leader

MAWL IN ACTION: PETER

When living in Kenya, I (Jeremy) was sifting through a few candidates for a position in the tech department and found Peter, a young Kenyan who was determined to ace not just his job but life itself. We worked side by side for several years until I moved to the US. However, distance



didn't dampen our collaboration. I continued to work alongside him as he became the Campus Tech Supervisor in Kenya.



Peter didn't stop at supervising—he expanded his role, bringing in two Deaf Kenyans and leading them as a team. His journey isn't confined to Kenya; he's taken his skills to other African countries. Peter is someone with a burning passion for co-leading a thriving Deaf ministry that resonates with DOOR's mission.



All of this fits into the MAWL concept. Peter's progression follows the concept: starting by learning the ropes (model), moving to assisting with leadership and team building (assist), being under a watchful eye as he took charge (watch), and finally being independent, contributing not just locally but on a broader scale (leave).



In celebrating Peter's achievements, we acknowledge the power of shared goals and empowering others to step into their leadership potential, and to DOOR's commitment to cultivating leaders through the MAWL approach.
