



THE JESUS FILM in ASL

In April, our whole family had the privilege of traveling to Texas for the red carpet premiere of Deaf Missions's The Jesus Film in ASL. Our son, Tyler, played the disciple John in the movie. It was an experience that we will never forget.

This film was made by the Deaf for the Deaf, and it was the first time the Deaf community had ever seen the life of Jesus told in their language through the lens of Deaf culture. With an all-Deaf cast and primarily Deaf crew, this is a unique milestone in Deaf history we are celebrating! The film is subtitled for anyone who doesn't know ASL.

One major difference between this film and the many films made for a non-Deaf audience is the heavy emphasis on facial expressions. We (Mark and Lyndalou) were profoundly moved by seeing the specific emotions written all over the actors' faces throughout the movie. We are grateful for subtitles that provide access to spoken language films, but we miss out on a lot of nuances which are conveyed through the actors' tones. In this film, we felt that we had complete access to the emotional range expressed in the feature.

The film will be in theaters across the country for special
